#### Gate Security

Although we are fully in the festive spirit in school we still have to be aware of the day to day issues of keeping the children safe. Recently, we have discovered that the electric pedestrian gate has been left open on a number of occasions. The gate ensures that anyone wishing to access the school site during the school day must speak with the school office to establish that they have a bona fide reason for doing so.

When visiting school, once the office staff have opened the gate for you please make sure that the gate is

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securely closed behind you. In addition, when leaving the site it is vitally important that for the safety of the children and staff you check that the gate is securely shut behind you.

We have put up some new signs to remind everyone of the need to close the gates to keep all the children safe and we would be grateful if you could remind others of the importance of closing the gate and checking that it has locked. Many thanks for your help in this matter. Please keep us safe and shut this gate.



#### Christmas Lunch and Christmas Jumper Day

This year our annual Christmas lunch will be served on Thursday 19th December. #### Pocket Toys Are Getting Bigger

We have noticed that pocket toys are increasing in size again and children are bringing multiple items to

school each day, so we would like to clarify the guidelines regarding what is an acceptable pocket toy. All pocket toys must be robust and small enough to fit into a child's pocket. Large, soft toys e.g. teddy bears and dolls which do not fit into a pocket are not allowed. Please do not bring anything which is precious or has great sentimental value as school cannot be responsible for pocket toys which are lost, damaged or broken. Trading cards e.g. Pokemon cards, are not allowed as they cause too many disagreements. We would be grateful if you could reinforce these guidelines with your children.
