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Parking Problems

Sadly, I must begin this newsletter with another reminder about parking.

I have received a number of complaints from parents about cars parking on the grass verge outside or near to the staff car park gates. This area is inside the yellow zig-zag lines which indicate that this is a no parking area. The Highway Code states that parking is prohibited on double yellow lines and yellow zig-zag lines outside schools at all times; this includes stopping to set down or pick up passengers.

Although the verge is not on school property we would request that parents and carers do not put children in danger by parking in this area. Not only is it illegal, but it makes it very difficult for vehicles leaving the school to see oncoming traffic, which increases the likelihood of an accident. In addition it is destroying the grass verge.

We would appreciate it if parents and carers could use the public car park in Priory Walk when dropping off and collecting children. Thank you for your support and understanding in this important matter.

Bring Your Wellingtons

We consider ourselves to be very lucky as we have an amazing resource in our school field. The children benefit from having a safe place to run, play and let off steam which, in turn, improves attention, decreases stress and anxiety, and prepares the children for their learning. Since half term the children have had to move back onto the playgrounds for the Winter months as the field has become very muddy and wet. The children have been telling me how much they miss playing on the field, as being on the playgrounds limits their opportunities to run freely and play the kinds of games they can enjoy when they have the space of the field.

After some thought we have decided that we would like to open the field for the children all year round and whatever the weather. To enable this to happen, it will be essential that each child has wellingtons to change into and a warm, waterproof coat to wear when the weather is inclement. The wellingtons will stay in school to be used every day.

If your child already has a pair of wellington boots that can be left in school, please send them into school from next week, so that they can enjoy playing on the field. If you have any spare wellingtons which your children have outgrown and you would like to donate them to school, we will be delighted to have them in school as spares. Our aim is to have all children in wellington boots and able to play on the field when we return to school in January.

Ask your Year 5 child to explain which material is the best thermal insulator and why.

Ask your Year 6 child to describe the separate components which make up blood.
