Safeguarding our Children

If you were wondering why I was absent from school on Thursday, it wasn't because I was relaxing at home, I was actually undertaking my Designated Safeguarding Lead refresher training. This takes place every two years and it is always quite a challenging day as some of the case studies we have to learn about are very upsetting and unsettling. However, at the centre of this is our statutory duty, as detailed in the document Keeping Children Safe in Education, to ensure children at Monkfield Park are able to flourish and thrive because they are protected and free from harm.

Sometimes protecting our children can seem like an insurmountable task as modern technology presents so many more risks—I spent the afternoon learning about the dangers posed by AI which really made my hair curl! We have to strike a balance between setting boundaries and putting in protective factors to teaching the children how to recognise and manage risk for themselves.

We are fortunate to have a dedicated Safeguarding Team at Monkfield Park but it is important to remember that safeguarding is everyone's responsibility. Every single person who comes into contact with children and their families has a role to play in keeping our children safe.

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If your child was born between 1st September 2020 and 31st August 2021, and you live in Cambridge-shire, you need to apply for a Reception place for September 2025 before the closing date of 15th January 2025. Applications received after this date will not be considered until the second round of allocations in May. 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Sentence starters

Ask your Reception child about how they use their kind hands at school.

Ask your Year 1 child to explain what a mammal is.

Ask your Year 2 child to count to 20 and then to 100.

Ask your Year 3 child to act out verbs to show what the Stone Age Boy learnt from Om.

Ask your Year 4 child to tell you how many different ways they can partition a 4 digit number.

Ask your Year 5 child to name the features of a persuasive advert.

Ask your Year 6 child to explain how to round a 5-digit number to the nearest multiple of 10, 100 and 1,000.

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Year 4 Enjoy Team Building

The ability to work as part of a team is a key skill that children need to develop as they move through school. These skills help children to learn together, listen carefully, communicate clearly with each other, and think creatively so that they become confident, independent learners. This week the children in Aquila and Cygnus Classes were challenged to develop their ability to work collaboratively by taking turns, ensuring fair play and praising and supporting each other. The children had great fun solving a range of problems such as Charlotte's Web; mastering the plank walkers and working out how to transport the whole team across an imaginary river. It was wonderful to see the children's confidence grow throughout the sessions.


