
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Individual and Sibling Photographs

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Many of you are already thinking about Christmas gifts and have been enquiring about when the school photographers will be visiting. I am pleased to announce that the photographers will be coming to school on Monday 9th October. They will be taking both individual and sibling photographs during the school day.

This is always an event which requires a lot of planning and organisation on the day. To enable the event runs as smoothly as possible, please can you ensure that your child comes to school dressed in their correct school uniform, which includes their green school sweatshirt or cardigan. The backgrounds used by the photographers are white and so the dark green sweatshirt provides the necessary



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contrast. If your child has PE on that day, please can they wear their school polo shirt and sweatshirt.

Please be aware that we need your consent to take your child's photograph. If you have not given consent to the school office we will not be able to take your child's photograph.

The photographers will be available to take photographs with siblings who attend pre-school from 8.30 am in the morning. If you have a pre-school aged child and would like to have their photograph taken with an older sibling, please could you all arrive in school at 8.30 am and enter the Activity Hall via the external hall doors which lead on to the staff car park. Please note that there may be a short waiting time if there is a demand for the family group photographs.

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If your child was born between 1st September 2019 and 31st August 2020, and you live in Cambridgeshire you need to apply for a Reception place for September 2024.

Sentence starters

Ask your Reception child to show you the skeleton dance.

Ask your Year 4 child to explain what having empathy means.

Ask your Year 6 child to name the colours in Spanish and include them in a sentence.

A Polite Reminder About Jewellery

For health and safety reasons jewellery and elaborate hair ornaments should not be worn to school. The only exceptions are watches and small studs for pierced ears—hoop earrings are not allowed to be worn in school. All jewellery items, including 'fitbits', MUST be removed during PE lessons and hair must be tied back to prevent injury. Children should remove their own earrings and store them safely or parents should remove them before the start of the school day. The Local Authority Health and Safety guidance no longer permits the taping of pierced ears during PE lessons. Staff cannot remove earrings for children or be responsible for storing them. As an alternative, silicone studs may be worn during PE lessons. Please can you check that all bracelets, bangles and necklaces are removed before your child comes to school each day. Thank you for your support in this matter.
